

How do I volunteer?

We will be happy to talk to you about our volunteer opportunities.

If you wish to volunteer, please fill out an application telling us about yourself and your interests. The Lodi Public Library reference desk has applications. Applications are also available on our website.

We will meet with you to discuss opportunities at the library and where you feel you fit.

Most volunteers at the Lodi Public Library must be fingerprinted. You will be given a form and contact information to help you set up your appointment with the Lodi Police Department. Fingerprinting is free.

We will then meet with you again to get you started: providing you with training and setting up mutually agreeable times for you to volunteer.

Additional Information

The Library can also accommodate groups that may wish to volunteer for defined projects and specific durations.

In order to volunteer, you must be at least 16 years of age.



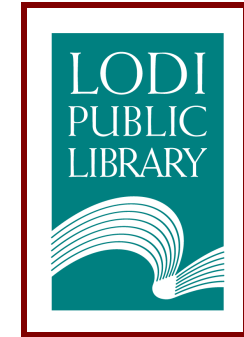
Who do I contact?
