RECOMMENDED ACTION: Adopt a resolution approving the purchase of encoder receiver transmitter equipped Itron solid-state meters from General Pacific of Portland, OR in the amount of \$295,000.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: In Resolution No. 2005-64, dated April 6, 2005, the City Council approved the standardization of solid-state meters for residential and small commercial customers with Itron. General Pacific is the exclusive supplier of these meters.

The Electric Utility Department (EUD) has been installing automated meter reading (AMR) Itron solid-state electric meters equipped with encoder receiver transmitters (ERT) since 2006 as part of an AMR project. Currently EUD is nearing completion of the residential installation of ERT-equipped solid-state meters and is beginning commercial installation. Six hundred meters have been budgeted in fiscal year 2011 for phase one of this project.

Staff hereby recommends the City Council approve the purchase of 600 ERT-equipped Itron solid-state meters from General Pacific.

FISCAL IMPACT: Procurement cost is \$295,000.

FUNDING: Included in FY2010/11 CIP Budget Account No. 161000.

AGENDA TITLE: Adopt Resolution Approving the Expansion of the San Joaquin County Enterprise Zone Boundary

MEETING DATE: November 23, 2010

PREPARED BY: City Manager

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Adopt a resolution approving the expansion of the San Joaquin County Enterprise Zone boundary.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: The State of California granted the San Joaquin County Enterprise Zone (SJCEZ) designation effective June 22, 2008. The designation is for 15 years. The Enterprise Zone offers attractive financial incentives for businesses located within the designated area of the zone, and is a key element not only in attracting but in retaining businesses in Lodi.

All industrial zoned property and most commercial property in Lodi is included in the zone. This proposed expansion, if approved by the County's other governing bodies and the State, will add Lodi Nut Company, a business office complex on Kettleman Lane/Mills Avenue, and the Chili's restaurant to the Enterprise Zone. Lodi Nut Company and the office complex did not qualify when the zone was originally drawn, and the exclusion of Chili's was an oversight. On Aug. 18, 2010, the City Council adopted a resolution acknowledging Lodi Nut Company's grandfathered industrial use at its Fairmont Avenue location to strengthen this expansion application.

As of Sept. 30, 2010, 74 Lodi businesses have taken advantage of Enterprise Zone benefits, submitting vouchers for 1,021 employees. Due to the tax credits available for hiring qualifying employees, these 74 businesses could see tax savings of as much as \$38 million over five years.

City and County staff have reviewed the Enterprise Zone inclusion requests and determined the parcels are eligible additions to the Zone. Attached is the map and parcel listing by jurisdiction of the proposed area to be added to the Enterprise Zone. The current SJCEZ is approximately 656 square miles. The expansion will add approximately 5.5 square miles and, for the first time, portions of Escalon and Ripon.

All expansion requests must be approved by all partner cities and the county. The California Department of Housing and Community Development will determine the effective date.


FISCAL IMPACT: The additions of Escalon and Ripon to the Enterprise Zone and expansions in other communities will reduce Lodi's share of zone marketing costs from \$21,766 in FY 2010/11 to \$21,464 in FY 2011/12.

FUNDING AVAILABLE: Upon FY 2011/12 budget adoption.

WHEREAS, San Joaquin County will submit a written request as required to the California Department of Housing and Community Development to have its enterprise zone boundaries expanded.



RECOMMENDED ACTION: Approve Lodi Tourism Business Improvement District (LTBID) 2011 Annual Report, adopt Resolution of Intention to Levy Annual Assessment, and set a public hearing for December 15, 2010 to consider the proposed assessment.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: Pursuant to Lodi Municipal Code Chapter 12.07 and Streets and Highways Code Section 36500 et seq., the LTBID membership Board is required to present an Annual Report (Exhibit A) for City Council's review and approval. This must be done prior to the public hearing and adoption of a resolution confirming the 2011 Annual Report and levy of assessment. The City collects an administrative fee of five percent from the LTBID assessment. Representatives of the LTBID will be in attendance to make a presentation. The levy of the annual assessment will be discussed at a public hearing on December 15, 2010.

The City provides additional funding to Visit Lodi! under a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) approved by the City Council on August 19, 2009. The MOU provides for an additional funding rate of 19 percent of the Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) collections. The MOU time period is July 1, 2009 to June 30, 2014.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funding for Visit Lodi! generates additional funding for local merchants and the City as tourism dollars are spent locally.

FUNDING AVAILABLE: \$76,000 included in the FY 2010/11 City budget.

Assessment Funding Purpose: To administer marketing programs to promote the City of Lodi as a tourism destination and to fund projects, programs, and activities that benefit hotels within the Business Improvement District boundaries

Method of Assessment: The LT BID includes all hotels/lodging facilities within the City of Lodi as well as two properties currently located at the intersection of Kettleman Ln. and I-5. Each lodging facility within the district shall be assessed 3% of the gross room rental revenue. Rentals (stays) lasting over 30 days are not subject to the assessment. The assessment is levied annual and collected quarterly.

2011 Work Plan

Marketing/Promotion Activities

Leisure Market

Targeted Advertising: Ads will be placed in designated target markets including the greater Sacramento and northern California region to promote Lodi. Ads will include a response measure for tracking purposes wherever possible. In 2011 staff will be continually researching the availability and feasibility of new marketing/advertising programs including web-based opportunities.

Trade Shows: Visit Lodi! will have a booth at the 2011 Bay Area Travel Show and Treasure Island Winefest. Staff will actively promote and recruit Lodi hotels and attractions to participate as vendors as a way to have a greater presence at the shows while increasing visibility and promotional opportunity for Lodi. All leads will be tracked and a database of contacts will be maintained for future marketing opportunities.

Visit Lodi! will partner with the Central Valley Tourism Association to promote and represent Lodi at the Los Angeles Times Travel Show. In addition, Visit Lodi! will research wine promotion opportunities at the Sunset Celebration Weekend Travel Show.

Taste of Lodi: Visit Lodi! will produce the 9th annual signature event to 1.) draw in visitors and 2.) showcase and market Lodi as a wine country tourism destination. Staff will work to increase the quality of the look and feel of the event by introducing additional vendor standards.

LodiView: Visit Lodi! will continue to offer LodiView as a monthly e-publication highlighting Lodi events and activities of interest to the tourist. Staff proposes to increase subscriber distribution by a minimum of 10%.

Research: In 2011 Visit Lodi! Staff will research the process and feasibility of promoting Lodi as a wedding destination.

Group Market

Tradeshows: Visit Lodi! will attend three sales shows created for the group market: The California Society of Association Executives (Cal SAE), the National Tour Operator Travel & Tourism Exchange, and SGMP. All sales leads will be followed up on and added to our database for future opportunities.

Fam Tours: Visit Lodi! Group Sales Manager will host quarterly Fam Tours for meeting planners and group decision makers as a tool to market Lodi as a group meeting destination.

Direct Mail Campaign: Quarterly fliers/brochures will be mailed to group sales decision makers to reinforce the Lodi tourism message.

Local Host Program: In 2011, the Group Sales Manager will make 12 presentations to local social groups and service clubs to promote the Host-at-Home Program. A 2011 Host-at-Home Award will be given out at the Annual Tourism Luncheon as a way to 1.) keep groups local as a top of mind perception for citizens and 2.) recognize individuals who participate in the program by referring groups to Visit Lodi! sales staff.

Sponsorships: Sponsorships at tradeshow will be utilized (when appropriate and as funding allows) as a method by which to introduce the group market to Lodi as a destination.

Customer Service/Hospitality

Visitor Information Packets: Visitor information will be distributed on request via email or through access on our website.

Website: The goal of the website is twofold: 1.) To educate and create awareness of Lodi as a visitor destination and to 2.) Provide the highest degree of customer service by ensuring that visitor information is complete, up-to-date and easily accessible. All other sections of the visitlodi.com website will be maintained and updated on a regular basis.

Visitor Publications: Visit Lodi! will develop and maintain a number of publications geared to increase availability of visitor information.

- **Lodi Travel Planner:** An updated Lodi Travel Planner will be presented for distribution in the Summer of 2011. The book which is designed to showcase Lodi to potential visitors and tourists is currently distributed to hotels, wineries, venues and other tourist attractions. It is one of the main marketing pieces for Visit Lodi! and is mailed upon request and is distributed at travel trade and sales shows. Consumers will be able to access the guide on-line and advertisers in the guide will have the ability to change their on-line ads 4 times throughout the year giving them flexibility in their advertising campaigns.

- **Festival & Events Calendar:** Visit Lodi! will produce an in-house designed/printed Festival & Events Calendar. The Calendar, produced annually, is a quick reference to events in the Lodi area and is distributed at the hotels, tradeshow, and in visitor information packets.
- **Visitor Attraction Map & Guide:** In January of 2011 Visit Lodi! will introduce an updated Visitor Attraction Map & Guide. The map will be distributed to hotels, wineries and attractions for their use and will be the main piece sent out to visitors requesting visitor information. The map is designed to fold into a brochure so that it can be used in a card rack or as a self-mailer.
- **Meeting Facilities Brochure:** Produced in-house, the Meeting Facilities Brochure is designed to provide information to potential consumers on event facilities.

Hotel Brochure Distribution: Visit Lodi! staff will provide a monthly brochure distribution service to all Lodi hotels, wineries and attractions. The goal is to ensure that visitor information is widely available and easily accessible to guests.

Communications

Newsletter: In 2011 Visit Lodi! will print and distribute two annual newsletters. The reports will be distributed to local constituents and individuals vested in the tourism industry as a way to inform the public as to the programs and services undertaken by the Conference & Visitors Bureau.

Twitter and Facebook: Staff will update Visit Lodi! Twitter and Facebook accounts weekly and proposes to increase followers by a minimum of 10%.

Committees

Hotel Council: The Visit Lodi! Hotel Council meets to exchange information about Lodi events, promotions, and programs and services. Beginning in 2011, the Council will meet on a quarterly basis.

1906—San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors declared Lodi duly incorporated as a municipal corporation.



1907—Lodi's population exceeded 2,000; the mission-style arch was built at Pine and Sacramento Streets at a cost of \$500; the Tokay Carnival was held to "advertise to the world the beauty and value of the Tokay grape."

1919—The original A&W Root Beer set up shop.



1928—The \$70,000, two-story, brick Italian Renaissance-style City Hall at 221 W. Pine St. was dedicated; the City paid cash for the building and furnishings.

It's the soil that makes this region so special. The grapes, originally the Tokay variety and now the zinfandel (among many others), love this loamy dirt, which is blessed with the perfect amount of sand so water drains just right. This earthy recipe allows the fruit to grow not too fast, not too slow.

Just as the grapes are smitten with the special soil, we think you'll find Lodi a particularly friendly place. For a town of fewer than 70,000 people, there's an expansive list of activities to immerse yourself in. Exploring nature. Golfing. Shopping and dining downtown. Arts. Theater. Museums. And then there's the wine.

Ahhh, yes, the wine. It's true that Lodi produces more wine grapes than those two other California towns. Combined. But what's more important is that success hasn't gone to our heads. The winemakers, the *actual* winemakers—often a 3rd or 4th generation grape grower—still talk wine with their guests. Pop open a bottle, pour it into a glass, sip, chat, repeat. It's amazing how well you get to know a wine when you can converse with the person who created it.

L O D I — A H I S T O R Y O F F A M I L Y W I N E R I E S

1860s—The Phillips family's Great Great Grandfather Andrew Harshner and his wife Lucille homesteaded 160 acres near the town of Lodi, following the Civil War. Today, Michael and David Phillips, of Michael-David Winery, represent the fifth generation of growers in Lodi with 650 acres of premium wine grapes.

Michael-David Winery



1907—George Mettler's great grandfather first purchased the Harney Lane land, and his grandfather planted its first vineyard. George has been farming essentially all his life. Today at Harney Lane Winery, they have charge over every element of the winemaking process, from the vineyard to the barrel to the bottle.

1920—Congress enacted prohibition. Although some farmers pulled up vines to plant other crops, the wine industry in Lodi continued to thrive.

1934—The First Lodi Grape Festival was held; 5,686 carloads of grapes were said to be shipped from Lodi that year.

More than 80 wineries bottle their gifts here. Together, they produce more than 450 labels boasting Premium Lodi Appellation wines. Some are familiar names from the market shelves. Mondavi's Woodbridge. Delicato. Talus. Others, like Michael~David, Berghold, Van Ruiten, Klinker Brick, Abundance, Grands Amis, Harney Lane and Macchia, for instance—are favorably ensconced in racks of respected wine sellers across the U.S.

What is practically universal here is the winemakers' desire to share with guests. At last count, there were 45 tasting rooms. Several offer private appointment-only tastings and banquet facilities for large parties, weddings or corporate gatherings. And you'll find many have outdoor picnic areas for enjoying the wine, noshing on your favorite delicacies, all the while basking in the fine weather and farm-fresh surroundings.

LODI—A HISTORY OF FAMILY WINERIES

1950s—Randy Randolph, with the help of his wife Charlotte (Peirano), continued the family lineage in the vineyard business. Their young son Lance—present day owner of Peirano Estate Vineyards—was by their side, learning at the age of four the art of winemaking. By the age of six, Lance was driving tractors.

1956—The Federal Government officially recognized Lodi as a wine grape growing district, allowing vintners to label their wines as originating in Lodi.


1966—Third generation Steve Borra and wife, Beverly, bought the remaining 30 acres of the original, now 100-year-old farm. After a decade of success, he formally started Borra Vineyards.

1979—Robert Mondavi bought the land and historic buildings on Woodbridge Road to turn into Woodbridge Winery—one of the largest table wine labels in the nation.

1983—The first annual Delicato Charity Grape Stomp, an outgoing community tradition celebrating old-world winemaking, took place.

History on the Vine.

A few opinions exist on how Lodi came by its name. Some have suggested the town was named in honor of Lodi, a local, fast-trotting horse that set an impressive four-mile record. Another camp says it was monikered after Lodi, Italy, the Mediterranean city where Napoleon celebrated his first victory over the Austrians. And then there are those who swear Lodi, Illinois is its namesake.

Whichever story you stand by, the fact remains clear that in 1874 Mokelumne (or Mokelumne Station) became Lodi, California.

Since its inception, the town has been a farming community, supported by a host of close-knit, farmer-friendly businesses and diversions.

Grapes have pretty much been at the heart of Lodi's growth. There was a time when watermelons and grains were part of the harvest. But it's Lodi's distinctive loamy soil and cool delta breeze that make grapes grow so richly. In fact, the climate and soil are so just-right that the Lodi Appellation was conferred upon the region in 1986. The designation is a purple badge of honor that's increasingly being seen in greater numbers on store shelves around the country.

Throughout its history, the town and its grapes have grown up together. Initially, the Tokay variety of table grapes pushed Lodi into national prominence. The fruit also made a passable wine, as well as sherry and ports, and distilled nicely into brandy.

Following the repeal of the Prohibition Act, however, Lodi truly came into its own. As American palates matured and their tastes shifted from dessert and table wines to more sophisticated inclinations, zinfandel production (along with other varietals) soon outpaced the Tokay.

Today, over 90,000 acres of zin, chardonnay, sauvignon blanc, viognier, syrah, merlot and cabernet sauvignon are harvested, carrying on a tradition that's been in place in Lodi for almost 140 years.






NATURE, SIGHTS AND LIQUID DELIGHTS.

Outdoor Recreation and Attractions Water has always played a central role in Lodi. The Mokelumne River’s fresh water, a product of snowmelt from the nearby Sierra Nevada, is what makes our grapes so special. It also plays an instrumental role as a source for fun and escape. Kayaking, pedal boating, swimming and fishing keep visitors and locals alike refreshed and laughing. For their day’s adventures, many visitors congregate on the shores of Lodi Lake, named by *Sunset* magazine as “one of the great inland beaches.”

Just outside the city limits, from September through February, birders get a special opportunity to watch the Greater and Lesser Sandhill Cranes make their annual migratory fly-in at the Sandhill Crane Reserve. Spying on a bird 5 feet tall and sporting a 7-foot wingspan is nothing short of breathtaking.

If you are looking for family adventure, Lodi has something entertaining for every member of the family. The Micke Grove County Park is a destination unto itself. Visitors can spend the day exploring the Micke Grove Zoo, sit in the shade of the Japanese Garden’s cherry blossom trees, or laugh and play together at Funderwoods Amusement Park. At the San Joaquin Historical Museum, visitors can learn about the history of the region, and see the antique tractor exhibit, the San Joaquin County Schoolhouse and the blacksmith shop.

Children and parents alike will enjoy a visit to the Serpentarium and the World of Wonders Science Museum, where education is fun and abundant. So, bring your curiosity and a desire to discover, and you’ll see that wine is only a part of Lodi’s charm.





A RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO LEVY ANNUAL ASSESSMENT FOR LODI TOURISM BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT, ESTABLISHING PUBLIC HEARING DATE, AND APPROVING ANNUAL REPORT

WHEREAS, Lodi Tourism Business Improvement District was established December 20, 2004, by City Council adoption of Ordinance 1753, and as amended by Ordinances 1756 and 1818; and

WHEREAS, the Annual Report as required by Streets and Highways Code §36533 has been submitted to the Council by the Board of Directors of said improvement district.

3. It is the intention of the City Council to levy and collect assessments within the Lodi Tourism Business Improvement District for calendar year 2011(the District's fiscal year).
4. The proceeds from the Lodi Tourism Business Improvement District assessment shall be used to administer marketing programs to promote the City of Lodi as a tourism destination and to fund projects, programs, and activities that benefit hotels within the City of Lodi. The boundaries of the Lodi Tourism Business Improvement District shall be the boundaries of the City of Lodi and County Service Area #31 (Flag City). Refer to the report on file in the Lodi City Clerk's office for a full and detailed description of the improvements and activities, boundaries, and proposed assessments for the 2011 fiscal year.
5. At the time of the public hearing, written and oral protests may be made. The form and manner of protests shall comply with Streets and Highways Code §36524 and 36525.
