NOTICE OF FUNDING AVAILABILITY
PUBLIC MEETING AND APPLICATION WORKSHOP**

The City of Lodi's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program is providing this Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) and is soliciting public input for the City's 2014-2019 CDBG Consolidated Plan and the 2014-15 CDBG Annual Action Plan.

The Consolidated Plan is a 5-year plan that provides: 1) a long-term planning document for the City of Lodi that builds on a participatory process; 2) an application for federal funds under HUD's CDBG formula grant program; and 3) a strategy to be followed in carrying out HUD's programs.

The Annual Action Plan serves as the annual budget for housing and community development activities funded by CDBG.

A public meeting will be held on January 8, 2014 (see info below) to solicit feedback on potential housing and community development activities, priorities, and needs for the five-year term of the Consolidated Plan and the first year of funding in the 2014-15 fiscal year.

The City is also soliciting applications for funding for activities that provide a benefit to low-income persons. Eligible organizations include non-profits and local government entities. Successful applications will address significant needs within the City and must meet the qualifications outlined in the Application Guidelines. If awarded, funding will be available July 1, 2014.

If you are interested in submitting an application for consideration, you must complete the application form (available on the City's website at www.lodi.gov or by e-mailing Joseph Wood (jwood@lodi.gov) or Rob Sronce (rsronce@lodi.gov), and submit it with all the required documentation by **February 12, 2014 at 5:00pm**, according to instructions included in the application.
