Got Drugs?

- ◆ Unused or expired prescription medications are a public safety issue, leading to accidental poisoning, overdose, and abuse.
- ◆ Non-medical use of prescription drugs ranks second only to marijuana as the most common form of drug abuse in America.
- ◆ Unused prescription drugs thrown in the trash can be retrieved and abused or illegally sold.
- ◆ Unused drugs that are flushed contaminate the water supply. Proper disposal of unused drugs saves lives and protects the environment.
- ◆ The majority of teenagers abusing prescription drugs get them from family and friends - and the home medicine cabinet.
- ◆ Each day, approximately, 2,500 teens use prescription drugs to get high for the first time, according to the Partnership for a Drug Free America.
